

NEICAC staff attain national certification

Monica Roderick, Northeast Iowa Community Action Corporation transit system administrator, and Daniel **Michels**, NEICAC housing property manager, have both attained the "certified community action professional" national designation know as CCAP.

The path to this certification includes a detailed review of an individual's documented education and experience as it relates to management and leadership, and to an individual's ability to publish a body of work that meets multiple criteria. They must pass a three-hour written examination that tests the individual's knowledge of community action, finance and budgeting and real world problem solving.
